1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

1.1. Purpose and Objectives of Mastering B1.O.28 Pediatrics

The purpose of mastering the discipline is achieving professional competencies by developing theoretical and practical skills of diagnosis and treatment of the main diseases of childhood and monitoring the harmonious development of a child, taking into account the relationship between dental pathology and disorders of other organs and systems of the child's body.

Objectives of mastering the discipline:

1. Examine the principles of organization and functioning of different types of pediatric institutions;
2. Acquire knowledge of the anatomical and physiological characteristics of childhood, characteristics of metabolism and immunity in children;
3. Acquire knowledge of age-related norms and the role of hereditary factors, as well as endogenous and exogenous factors, in the development of health or disease in children;
4. Learn about the most important methods of clinical and laboratory diagnostics that allow identifying the most common diseases of children and adolescents;
5. Learn to identify the leading clinical symptoms and syndromes of the most common diseases in children and adolescents;
6. Reveal the links between dental diseases and general childhood pathology.

6. ASPECTS OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DISCIPLINE FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES AND SPECIAL NEEDS**6.1. Availability of Accessible Environment**

For students with disabilities and special needs, if a written application is submitted, lectures and practical classes are carried out taking into account health limitations, individual capabilities and medical status (hereinafter referred to as individual characteristics) of the student. Compliance with the following general requirements is ensured: teaching aids for collective and individual use are provided, required technical assistance is provided by an assistant; buildings and premises where lectures and practical classes are taking place meet accessibility requirements, other arrangements lack of which makes it impossible or difficult to master the discipline are made.
